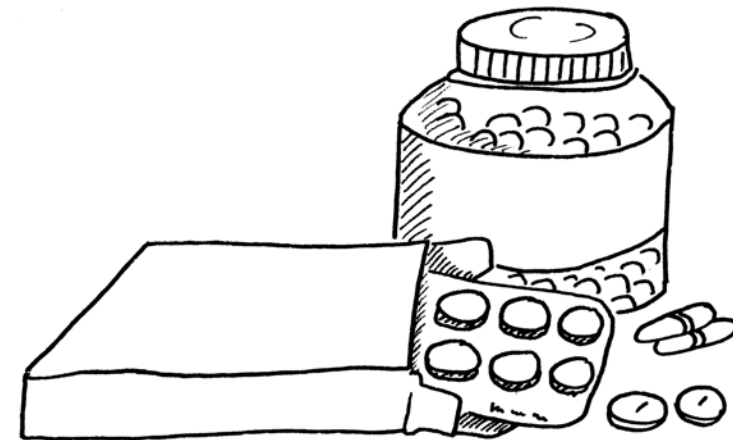

- you feel shaky



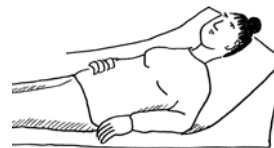
- You can't see properly
